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## **Executive Summary**

This Primary Care Report details some key measures in Primary Care and shows variation in secondary care activity across the Primary Care Networks and GP Practices.

## **Population**

North Yorkshire CCG has a lower proportion of patients under the age of 20 than the national average, but a higher proportion of over 65s.

Only 8 out of 51 GP Practices have a deprivation score higher than the national average (higher = more deprived). 19% of the CCG p opulation are registered at these 8 practices.

#### **Patient Satisfaction**

Latest Friends & Family figures (February 2020) show that 93% of patients would recommend their GP service to a friend or member of their family. This is compared to a national figure of 90% The GP Survey (July 2020) shows favourable responses for North Yorkshire CCG compared with national figures. 89% of patients reported that their experience at their GP Practice was either Very Good or Fairly Good. This is compared with 82% nationally.

## COC

98% of GP practices in North Yorkshire have a CQC rating of Outstanding or Good

#### Workforce

North Yorkshire CCG has 66.7 GP WTEs for every 100,000 registered patients compared with a figure of 54.9 nationally. The CCG also has a higher number of Nurse WTEs per 100,000 registered patients with 35.7 compared with 27.2 nationally.

#### Disease Prevalence

QOF 2018/19 figures show that the CCG has a higher prevalence of Stroke/TIA, Coronary Heart Disease, COPD, Cancer and Dementa than the national average. The prevalence is lower than national figures for Diabetes.

## **GP Appointments**

The impact of coronavirus has seen GP appointments fall by 24% in the first three months of 2020/21 compared with last year. This is comparable with national rates. Face-To-Face appointments have fallen by 47% and Non Face-To-Face appointments have increased by 130%. National levels have seen more of a reduction in Face-To-Face appointments though and more of an increase in Non Face-To-Face.

## **Secondary Care Activity**

The coronavirus pandemic has had a significant impact on secondary care activity. The first few months of 2020/21 have seen a sharp drop in activity in most services. The year on year changes between 2019/20 and 2020/21 are:
